San Jacinto College expects that a student will normally graduate under the catalog in effect at the time of the most recent admission. For nursing and other specialized programs, the term of acceptance into the program determines the catalog year. When the elapsed time from initial enrollment to program completion is extended, individual courses may have been replaced or canceled. Educational planners will assist students in the selection of appropriate courses.
