Registration Requirements:

- Must bring High School Diploma or Equivalent to Registration
- Must present a government-issued, valid picture ID (driver's license, passport, State ID) at time of registration.
- Registration is in person and on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Children may not be present for testing and registration or during classes.
- No appointment necessary
- Registration and Testing is required to begin classes.
- *19 years of age or older (18 years old with an official withdrawal form from public school and a letter of consent from your parent, 16 years old with a Court Order)
- Please provide Government assistance documentation at time of Registration. (Ex. SNAP, Child Care and Development Fund (CCDF) services, TANF, CHIP, Medicaid, WIC, Housing assistance documents)
