- **Must present a government-issued, valid picture ID (driver's license, passport, State ID) at time of registration.**
- Must bring your own blue or black ink pen at time of registration
- Registration is in person and on a first-come, first-served basis
- Children may not be present for testing and registration or during classes
- No appointment necessary
- Registration and Testing is required to begin classes
- \*19 years of age or older (18 years old with an official withdrawal form from public school and a letter of consent from your parent, 16 years old with a Court Order)
