1) **Apply-** <https://www.sanjac.edu/admissions-aid/admissions>

- Students are required to complete the free Texas Common Application for 2 year schools at www.applytexas.org, you will receive an acceptance letter via email from San Jacinto College within 2 business days.

2) **Meningitis-**

- If you are younger than 22, email your meningitis vaccination record to meningitis.docs@sjcd.edu Visit <https://www.sanjac.edu/meningitis> for more information along with scheduled times the college will be offering the vaccination on site.

Please continue to consult with our website for updated information regarding submission of required documentation.

Requirement: The 82nd Texas Legislature requires that all incoming Texas College students must receive a vaccination or booster against bacterial meningitis.

Who: The Vaccine is required for all new students to San Jacinto College (including dual credit students) beginning in the Spring 2012 term, and for returning San Jacinto College students who have had a break in enrollment for one or more Fall or Spring terms. Transfer students are considered new students. Also, all incoming Continuing and Professional Development students taking “linked” courses are required to receive meningitis vaccinations. A linked CPD course is any course held in conjunction with an academic/credit course.

What: The student or parent or guardian of the student must provide a certificate signed by a health practitioner or an official immunization record showing the student has received the bacterial

meningitis vaccination or booster during the five-year period prior to enrollment, and not less than ten days before the first day of classes. Two ways to receive the meningitis vaccination are either through a private physician's office or clinic, or through a public clinic, such as Harris County Health Department clinics.

3) Submission of Transcripts-

In Person
Unopened transcripts can be hand-delivered to the [Admissions office](#) at the nearest San Jacinto College campus. To be considered official, transcripts physically submitted must be in a sealed envelope from the issuing school.
College transcripts must be issued within **60 days**. High school transcripts can be issued at any time so long as they remain sealed.

To be considered official, college transcripts must be mailed from your institution within **60 days** of the print day.

Electronically
San Jac accepts electronic transcripts from the following companies: Credentials eScrip-Safe, Parchment, National Student Clearinghouse (NSC), or via EDI/SPEEDE.
Transcripts emailed to the College are not accepted.

- Verify Texas GED completion with the Admissions office at your appropriate campus. GED Transcripts from out state must be obtained from the state of origin by the student.

Certification Testing

MDCA graduates are eligible to take a National Certification Examination, either the Registered Medical Assistant Exam given by the American Medical Technologists to earn the RMA credential, the Certified Medical Assistant Exam given by the

American Association of medical Assistants to earn the CMA (AAMA) credential or the The National Center for Competency Testing (NCCT)-NCMA.

Medical Assistants work in physician offices, hospital-based clinics, and ambulatory health care facilities.

Average Salary
